


Global and Korean Air Cargo Trends

■ Global airfreight rates begin to rise in April

Global airfreight rates on major east—west trades began to creep back up in Apr following the previous month's decline, as demand began to rise in line with seasonal trends. The latest figures from the Baltic Exchange Airfreight Index show that in Apr the average rate from HKG to N/America reached \$9.57 per kg, which is 12.9% up on a year earlier and an increase on the \$8.18 per kg registered in Mar. From HKG to EU average rates stood at \$6.01 per kg, which is up 30.4% compared with last year and also an increase on the \$5.09 per kg registered in Mar.




The month-on-month increase is in line with seasonal trends at this time of year as volumes begin to creep back up following X-mas and New Year holidays. The year-on-year increase comes as the market continues to be buffeted by disruption as the Ukraine war has affected Asia-Europe flights and Covid lockdowns and travel restrictions in SHA and HKG have also affected operations. These developments come on top of the ocean shipping issues and air cargo

capacity shortages that also affected the industry last year. Rates from SHA, meanwhile, have been changing from week to week; while there are trucking issues and air cargo capacity has been reduced by around two thirds over the last few weeks, factory production has also been slashed due to the lockdown restrictions resulting in reduced demand. Prices from SHA to N/America in Apr had a peak of \$10.12 per kg and a low of \$9.12 per kg. On the transatlantic, prices from FRA to N/America in Apr climbed to \$5.40 per kg from \$4.89 per kg a month earlier. [Source: Aircargo News]

Guideline to send cargo to Russia by TK

- ① In case of SVO, the documents must be submitted and prior confirmation is required (shipper's memorandum, import certificate, invoice & packing list)
- ② The product name on MAWB must match that of Invoice
- ③ Cargo under the Korea Strategic Goods and Export Control Regulations is not allowed.

AF/KL (AIRFRANCE/KLM)

- ① BSA process every SAT on AF267 ETD 02:25-ETA 09:35
- ② LHR/BCN/MAD/ FRA can be connected next day.
- ③ It is possible to forward as a separate E-COMMERCE cargo by CSRT.
- 4 Providing the lowest rates for more than 100kg.

EUROPEAN MARKET TRENDS – MAY

Last April was mostly dependent on domestic traffic in the aftermath of China's lockdown policy and it was expected that demand would rebound when the lockdown was eased in May. However, overall market demand slump is expected to continue for the time being in May as production is reduced due to the lockdown.

- OZ: FSC to be imposed from 16May'22 [long haul: KRW1,180/Kg, medium range: KRW1,110/kg, short haul: KRW1,050/kg]

Other Airline & Forwarder's information

 OZ: Asiana Airlines (CEO Jeong Seong-gwon) will expand its flights across various routes including the Americas/Australia/Asia in line with the government's plan to lift self-isolation and normalize international flights.



In particular, on long-distance routes, ICN-LAX flights will be increased four times a week in May alone, returning to twice a day (14 flights a week) before Corona 19. The ICN-SYD route, which previously operated twice a week, has been increased to three times a week (Wed, Fri, and Sun), and from July, the number of flights will be increased to four a week. Flights to Asia will also be significantly increased. Japan operates ICN-OSA twice a week and operates once a day, and ICN-FUK operates three times a week with an increase of once a week. Southeast Asia operates ICN-HAN from 6 to 7 times a week, ICN-PNH from 5 to 7 times a week, and ICN-SGN and ICN-MNL from 7 to 10 times a week, respectively. In addition, from April 29 (Friday), India's DEL routes will resume once a week, and this is the first regular flight service in

- about 33 months since the suspension on July 8, 2019. OZ said, "We have increased flights 18 times a week for a total of 9 routes, which is the largest monthly increase since Corona 19." [CargoPress]
- EU: The European Union's Aviation Safety Agency (EASA) has announced that it will stop the carriage of in-flight cargo after July 31.



In the wake of the coronavirus pandemic, in-flight cargo transport has been operating as a temporary waiver since 2020, and EASA has extended the rule for August 2021, but will not extend it again, it said in a statement on April 11. EASA expects to increase passenger flight operations from the summer of 2022, and has clearly instructed the ban on extension this time after approval of the existing two extensions on the premise that the existing air logistics space is resolved. China's Civil Aviation Administration (CAAC) has also announced that it will restrict the carriage of in-flight cargo other than those related to the coronavirus from January 2022. Meanwhile, according to the industry, in most regions except for China, in-flight cargo transportation is rare, and most of the cargoconverted passenger aircraft are moving cargo to the belly.
