Xeneta: Air cargo rate growth narrows and the market outlook is daunting

Air cargo freight rate improvements continued to narrow in April amid weakening demand, geopolitical tariff tensions and a drop in jet fuel prices.

While global air cargo volumes grew 4% year on year in April, global air cargo spot rates rose just 3% year on year, a second consecutive month of only a single-digit increase, said Xeneta, and a continuation of a narrowing of the growth rate.

Rates were up 17% in January, 10% in February and 6% in March. "This slowdown aligns with weaker demand trends. Adding to the downward pressure on rates, jet fuel prices fell –24% year–on–year in the first three weeks of April," said Xeneta.

"This drop, driven by ongoing economic and geopolitical uncertainties, likely played a role in tempering overall spot rate growth."

In addition to this, available capacity increased 3% compared to April 2024, and the dynamic load factor declined three percentage points month on month to 57%.


The dynamic load factor is Xeneta's measurement of capacity utilisation based on volume and weight of cargo flown alongside available capacity.

US tariff measures implemented on 2 April prompted shippers to engage in front-loading tactics, and there was a rush of air shipments from several Asian countries to North America. This led to double-digit increases in both volume and spot rates out of Asia

Notably, spot rates from Southeast Asia to North America jumped 13% month on month, while those from Northeast Asia rose 10%. However, these gains began reversing in the second half of April following the announcement of a 90-day tariff pause and 145% retaliatory tariffs on China.

The largest monthly rate surge was observed on the North America


 Northeast Asia corridor, rising 14%. This was largely driven by shippers rushing exports to China and Hong Kong amid fears of reciprocal tariffs. [AirCargoNews]

1 Lufthansa Cargo ups South America freighter flights

Lufthansa Cargo is increasing its weekly capacity to Argentina and Brazil as it looks to capitalise on raw material and agricultural trade growth.

The Frankfurt-hubbed freighter operator will add an extra weekly flight to its summer schedule for Boeing 777 freighter flights covering Buenos Aires in Argentina and Curitiba in Brazil.

The additions mean that Lufthansa will now fly to South America four times per week – twice to Buenos Aires and twice to Curitiba.

The airline said the additional flights were made possible by steering its schedule more efficiently rather than dropping flights from elsewhere.

"With strong export sectors such as agricultural products, energy and raw materials, Argentina remains an important pillar in the South American trade network despite the dynamic global economic situation," Lufthansa Cargo said in a press release.

"Together with markets such as Brazil, Chile, Peru and Uruguay, which are valued globally for their exports of raw materials and agricultural products, the region is an increasingly important hub for intercontinental trade flows.

"At the same time, demand for high-value imported goods such as machinery, electronics and automobiles is growing throughout the region – a demand that Lufthansa Cargo, as a specialised airfreight expert with reliable connections for these sensitive goods from Europe, is specifically addressing.

"The Lufthansa Group's cargo carrier is therefore systematically strengthening its presence in South America and relying on long-term partnerships in a market with great strategic potential."

The flights also include stops in Viracopos (VCP) and Montevideo (MV/D)

In addition, Lufthansa Cargo offers its customers up to 20 weekly rotations from Frankfurt and three rotations per week from Munich to South America with additional belly capacities within the Lufthansa Group.

Lufthansa Cargo chief executive Ashwin Bhat said: "South America is and will continue to be an important growth market for Lufthansa Cargo. Especially in the perishables industry, we have built strong partnerships with our customers over the last three decades."

Bhat was speaking during a naming ceremony in Argentina for the carrier's latest 777 - delivered last year. The freighter was given the

name Hola Argentina. [AirCargoNews]

As a result, the airline's direct flights to North America will be expanded to nine routes from eight routes: Los Angeles (LAX), San Francisco (SFO), Seattle (SEA), New York (JFK), Houston (IAH), Chicago (ORD), Vancouver (YVR), and Toronto (YYZ).

Meanwhile, the airline has been operating cargo flights in Dallas, Texas since 1998. [Cargo News]

3 MH: Malaysia Airlines to significantly expand Australia routes

Malaysia Airlines (MH) announced that it will resume daily flights to Kuala Lumpur (KUL) and Brisbane (BNE) from November 29. In addition, Melberun (MEL) and Sydney (SYD) routes will be expanded sequentially. Melberun routes will be expanded to 18 flights per week from August 29 and 21 flights from October 30, respectively. Sydney routes will also be expanded to 17 flights per week from August 30 and 18 flights from October 4. [Cargo News]

4 SEVA Acquires Turkiye Logistics Company For \$400 Million

SEVA acquired Borusan Tedarik, a Turkiye logistics company, for a total of \$400 million (about 575.7 billion won) in cash and debt. Borusan Tedaric is a logistics company that provides contract logistics, finished vehicle logistics, inland transportation, shipping, and customs clearance services. It operates branches in China, Hong Kong, Germany, and Bulgaria, as well as its headquarters in Turkiye. With the acquisition, Seva will operate 4,000 employees in Turkiye, combined with its existing organization. The area of warehouses and distribution centers in Turkiye has also doubled from the previous one to 12.9 million square meters.

Meanwhile, CMA CGM, a French shipping company, has been pursuing a series of mergers and acquisitions since it merged Cebarogistix in 2019. It has merged the e-commerce and lifestyle services divisions of VoloLerogistix, GEFCO, and Ingram Micro. Last year, it also merged last-mile delivery company, the Colis Privé Group. [Cargo News]
